We will be practising how commas help to make our sentences clearer and more effective.</p> <p>We will also be revisiting previously taught skills to consolidate grammatical concepts.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Numeracy</u></p> <p>In Maths, we are focusing on money. Primary 5 will develop their skills in managing money, comparing prices from different retailers, and making sensible choices about what they can afford to buy.</p> <p>In Numeracy, we will be developing our multiplication and division skills, extending this to include decimal fractions. We will also use partitioning strategies to support calculations involving multi-digit numbers, as well as to solve division problems.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Social Studies</u></p> <p>Due to the World Cup kicking off in June, and Scotland having qualified, we will be learning all about the World Cup and the different countries that will be playing at it. They will explore key topics including Forces, Electricity and Waves, with a focus on concepts such as friction, magnetic forces, sound, light and simple circuits. Through hands-on investigations and collaborative tasks, pupils will deepen their understanding and curiosity about how the world around them works.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Technology</u></p> <p>ICT and digital technologies will be used to support research, collaboration, and creativity throughout our topic, enabling pupils to investigate Scotland, Canada, and the World Cup using safe online sources.
