

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></p> <p>In Health and Wellbeing, Primary 6 will be learning about sexual health and developing their understanding of how their bodies grow and change. This is an important area for building personal awareness and confidence. We will also explore the effects of alcohol and tobacco on the body, helping pupils make informed and healthy choices. In Physical Education, pupils will continue to develop their skills in tennis and athletics, focusing on improving technique, coordination, and overall fitness.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Literacy</u></p> <p>This term, Primary 6 will be building upon spelling, comprehension, grammar and cursive handwriting skills during our weekly stations. Reading groups will build on reciprocal reading skills during literacy circles with the Publishers and Editors continuing their independent book studies.</p> <p>Our focus for writing this term will be narrative writing. This will involve using our imaginations and literacy skill to create engaging pieces of work that entertain our audience.</p> <p>We will also be focusing on our listening and talking skills are the pupils will prepare a solo-talk. This is a great opportunity to build skills which will support them in the world of work.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Numeracy</u></p> <p>Primary 6 will be moving on to algebra, an exciting topic where previously taught concepts such as multiplication and division can be applied. Pupils will also develop their ability to recognise and continue patterns, helping to build strong problem-solving skills.</p> <p>We will be finishing our work on Time before moving on to Shape and Information Handling, where learners will explore properties of shapes and begin interpreting data in different ways. This next stage of learning will support pupils in making connections across different areas of mathematics.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Social Studies</u></p> <p>In Social Studies, Primary 6 will explore the topic "Comparison of Scotland and Brazil," developing their understanding of different cultures, geography, traditions, and current social issues. Pupils will take an active role in their learning by researching and presenting information through PowerPoints and posters, helping to educate others. This will support the development of confidence, communication skills, and respect for diversity, while encouraging thoughtful discussion and reflection.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Expressive Art</u></p> <p>In Term 3, we will focus on drama as we rehearse and perform a Nursery Story for our buddies. This is a great way for the Primary 6's to develop confidence at presenting in front of a group as well as a super opportunity for team-work.</p> <p>In addition, we will be looking at music and rhythm. Pupils will have opportunities to create and perform their own rhythmic patterns, building confidence and creativity.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>In Science, Primary 6 pupils will continue to develop a range of skills while taking greater responsibility for leading their own learning in the Discovery Zone. They will explore key topics including Forces, Electricity and Waves, with a focus on concepts such as friction, magnetic forces, sound, light and simple circuits. Through hands-on investigations and collaborative tasks, pupils will deepen their understanding and curiosity about how the world around them works.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Technology</u></p> <p>In ICT, Primary 6 will be using Excel to support and enhance their information handling skills, learning how to organise and present data effectively. Pupils will also take on a leadership role within the school by supporting younger learners in developing their iPad and laptop navigation skills. This will help build confidence, responsibility, and digital competence while encouraging collaboration and communication.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Languages</u></p> <p>Over Term 3, Primary 6 will continue to expand their knowledge of Spanish.
