## Primary

It is preferred that our primary pupils will wear the same uniform as the secondary pupils (see following pages), however in some cases pupils may wear a light blue polo shirt and grey jumper.



## Secondary

**Blazers** All pupils are encouraged to wear a black school blazer with the Garnock Community Campus badge. Blazers can be purchased from Embroidery Solutions). In the senior phase (S4-S6) it is expected that all pupils will wear blazers.

**Black Skirts** Skirts must be of a suitable length.

**Black Trousers** Formal school trousers.

**White Shirts** A formal white school shirt must be worn tucked in.

**Black Jumpers** A plain black V-neck jumper or cardigan, where the tie is clearly visible, can be worn.

### Ties

The Garnock Community Campus tie should be worn by all pupils (ties can be purchased from the school office, priced £5.00)

### Black Footwear

All pupils must wear smart black footwear.

### Outerwear

Dark, plain jackets can be worn. Outdoor jackets must be removed in class.

### PE Kit

T Shirts, shorts or tracksuit bottoms and training shoes. Pupils are not allowed to wear football colours or anything that may cause offence.



## The following items are not allowed as part of the policy

- Jeans (of any colour).
- Tracksuit trousers.
- Leggings without a skirt.
- Insignia that includes inappropriate symbols.
- Hoodies of any sort.
- Patterned or fashion tights.
- Coloured tops over or under shirts.
- Coloured trainers
- Excessive jewellery (pupils will be asked to remove facial piercings)
- Baseball boots.

Any customer who meets the qualifying criteria for a grant and has not received a grant in the 2016/17 session

Working Tax Credit and Child Tax Credit (with an income under £6,420)

Universal Credit

## Automatic Renewal

### Who's eligible?

Any customer who received a clothing grant in 2016 and has an active Housing Benefit or Council Tax Reduction claim

### How they will be notified?

Customers will receive a letter or email advising them of their eligibility

### Renewal

Providing the customers circumstances haven't changed a payment will be made automatically by their previous chosen payment and no further action will be required on their part

### Change of Circumstance

Change of circumstances can be submitted using the **web link in the email/letter, in person or by calling 01294 310000**

## Manual Renewal

### Who's eligible?

Any customer who has received a clothing grant in 2016 but we have been unable to confirm their eligibility in house.

### How they will be notified?

Customers will receive a letter or email advising them of their eligibility

### How to renew?

**Online** via the link provided in the letter or email

**In person** at one of the Customer Service Centres

**New applications** will be accepted from **1st June**  
**Renewals** will start from **15th May**
