Dalry Primary is a non-denominational school with a roll of 276 pupils, split into 12 classes from P1 to P7.

Attainment 2021-2022

Most pupils have achieved the expected levels by the end of Primary 1, Primary 4 and Primary 7 We are attaining in line with our

comparator quartile schools and the North Ayrshire average for Reading, Writing, Listening and Talking and Numeracy and attaining slightly higher for our Primary 7s

We are pleased with the progress our pupils are making. We are continuing to track and monitor the progress of all pupils and identify support needs in a timely manner. Our attendance continues to be above 90% for most of our pupils. This will continue to be monitored on a 4 week cycle. We have also had no exclusions during session 2021-2022.

Pupil Equity Funding

This session we have spent our funding on:

- A Youth Worker—Mrs Caig
- Class teacher to focus on targeted support to raise attainment specifically in Literacy— Reading and Writing
- A Principal Teacher to specifically target our attainment in Reading and Writing and oversee the interventions
- Classroom Assistants to focus on targeted support to raise attainment in Literacy and Numeracy
- Two Early Years Practitioners to support the development of play based learning in Primary 1 and ensure high quality Literacy and Numeracy experiences for our infant pupils
