Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to our February newsletter. Firstly, I wanted to thank all our parents and carers who attended the Learning Conversations at the beginning of February. It was lovely to see so many people attend, if you have any questions or concerns regarding the follow up paperwork you were sent out then please feel free to phone the school to discuss further.

Earlier this term I issued a Microsoft Forms to parents and carers to gather your views on how the Cost of the School Day funding should be spent. There was a great response to this survey and 86% of parents and carers voted to use this money for summer trips for all pupils resulting in no extra cost for parents and carers. This was also the most popular choice in our pupil survey. This year's summer trip will be Bounce Station in the morning and lunch at Eglinton Country Park in the afternoon, with the pupils returning to school at 3pm. As a school we were awarded £3040 for the year. This does not fully cover the cost of the trip so we have decided to use approximately £1500 from our school fund to ensure there is no charge for parents and carers. We are grateful we are in a position to be able to offer this for our families.

Monday 13th March is the start of our focus STEAM Week.


STEAM activities require gathering and using evidence to create knowledge or solve problems. STEAM learning happens naturally everyday as children explore, play, and try new things.

Progress Meetings

As part of our quality assurance procedures the Senior Leadership Team meet with Class Teachers each term for Pupil Progress Meetings.

A pupil progress meeting allows staff to analyse and discuss factors that have supported pupils' progress and identify barriers preventing progress. Evidence is collected from day-to-day assessments, and then questioning is based on the data collected.

The aims of pupil progress meetings are to enable:

- · Staff engagement in professional dialogue related to pupil progress
- Scheduled time to discuss and value teacher judgements
- · SLT is made aware of the progress in each cohort
- Identifying pupils who are making at least expected progress and on track to meet their target
- · Identifying vulnerable pupils
- · Analysing the impact of interventions
- · Collaborative decision on the deployment of support staff and resources
- A collaborative approach to naming actions

What do you want to gain in pupil progress meetings?

- Professional dialogue on data analysis
- Updated data record showing children on target for age-related and on track for the end of level target.
- · Identify successes and areas for development
- Identify vulnerable groups
- · Plan of action for each class

We are delighted with the progress of all of our learners across all stages. We continue to strive to ensure every child is supported to reach their full potential and that the quality of teaching and learning within our school is of a very high standard.
