Parent/Carer Workshop

Primary 2C and Primary 3/2H - Tuesday 31st October 9:00am - 9:45am.


Primary 3M and <u>P3's only from Primary 3/46</u> - Wednesday 1st November 9:00am - 9:45am.



Homework

Thank you to everyone who took part in our Microsoft Forms about homework in school. The results were very interesting and helpful in supporting us to make a decision regarding homework as a school.

The majority of parents/carers said that homework was stressful at home due to other commitments throughout the week and also parents/carers working full time jobs. As indicated in the form I sent out, there has been research to suggest that homework does not have a big impact on overall attainment. I agree with this and feel that children should be able to relax and enjoy their time at home, after working hard in school for 6 hours each day.

Based on the feedback we have decided that after the October holiday, we will issue reading weekly for each child and this will be a book that they bring home and not an online book. Your child will also be issued with another family task, this will be optional and might consist of taking family walk, reading a story together as a family or watching a family movie together etc. This should promote that family time is also a very important aspect of your child's life.

Some parents/carers had commented that they liked homework to see what their child is doing at school so they feel up to date with their learning. We feel that Seesaw and accessing that will give you a weekly update as to what your child is doing within school, you will be able to view photographs, videos and then make comments on these for your child to see. We also have Learning Conversations where targets are set and reviewed three times throughout the year, as well as curricular showcases each term.
