#### Parent/Carer Survey Feedback

Thank you to all who managed to participate in our survey at the recent Learning Conversation. Your views are essential in supporting us make improvements within the school. I wanted to give you an update on the responses we have had.

95% agree that school helps me feel safe

97% agree they have someone to talk to in school if they feel upset

97% agree that staff treat me fairly and with respect

82% agree that other pupils treat me fairly and with respect

95% agree that my school helps me to understand and treat other people fairly

90% agree that the school listens to their views

97% agree that staff help me to understand how I am progressing with school work

100% agree that they enjoy learning at school

When asked what we could do better these were some of the suggestions as well as what I have done about this based on your feedback:

- Newsletter can be difficult to access in current format at times Thank you for bringing this to my attention, as I was unaware that this was an issue. I have also put this on the website in a PDF format and hopefully this can be easier for some families to access the address for our school website is https://blogs.glowscotland.org.uk/na/dalryprimary/
- Anti-bullying protocols made clearer to pupils I will address this during assembly time
  with pupils across P1-7. We will also have a focus on this in class so there is a clear and
  consistent message. Our anti-bullying policy is also available for parents/carers on our
  school website.
- Concerns regarding portion sizes and food choices in the lunch hall The menu and
  portion sizes are set by the local authority and is the same across all schools, therefore
  this is not something that I am able to change.
- There are still concerns regarding the toilets in relation to design and smell –
  unfortunately there is not anything I can do about the design of the toilets, however I
  am in touch with facilities management about the smell and they are looking into air
  fresheners that could be used and would be friendly to pupils who have allergies and
  asthma. Hopefully these can be installed and reduce the smell within the toilets.
- I appreciate everyone's feedback and I hope you feel that any feedback given is
  listened to and addressed in a timely manner. It is also really nice for staff to hear
  about the aspects of school life you feel we are doing well.

Our toilets are also another area that can cause concern for staff and parents/carers. I would appreciate if you could encourage your child to be as independent as possible with toileting and reminders to flush the toilet and wash hands afterwards would be great. We will continue to reinforce this within the school also so children are receiving a consistent message and in turn our toilets should be a nicer environment for our pupils if these routines are followed.
