Parents are putting the safety of our children at risk. Think before parking!

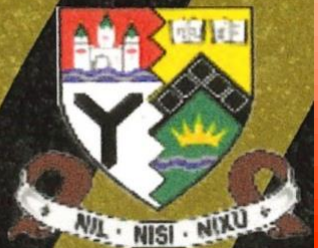


- Do not park on or near the zebra crossing

P5M are really enjoying developing their skills and cascading their learning with classes and staff.



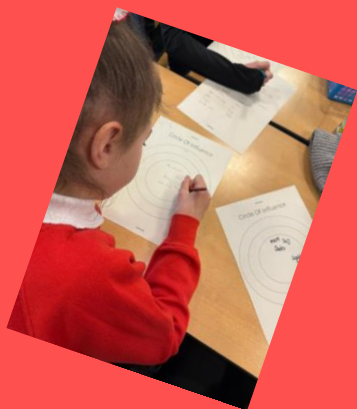
Fruit Tree Planting
