Health and Wellbeing

In term 3 we will continue to spend a lot of time outdoors. Numeracy

Literacy

In term 3 we will continue to focus on reading for enjoyment, with library visits and encouragement to use the iPads to access reading materials. We will focus our talking and listening on group discussions and listening to and understanding the opinions of others this term.

Expressive Arts

Our art work will continue to be focused around the interests of the children in term 3. We will support and encourage the children to create models, pictures and other pieces of work based around their wide and varied range of interests.

Inter-Disciplinary Learning

The class topic this term will be Scotland. The children will learn about the history of their country, Scottish landscapes and will explore Geography through this topic. The children will be able to use Google Maps and Google Earth, apps that they show a particular interest in, in order to explore the topic.
