


Elderbank Primary School

We have a number of little reminders and information items to share which we thought would be helpful.

Informal Entry

We have an informal entry from 08:50a.m. and the children are supervised by Classroom Assistants while they prepare to be ready to learn at 09:00a.m.

Water Bottles in class

Children are encouraged to keep hydrated throughout the day. Only plain tap water is permitted in water bottles in class.



If your child prefers juice or flavoured water they will be able to access this at break times.

Stationery

The school will provide all pupils with necessary stationery supplies they need in school.

Clothing and Personal Belongings

Please clearly mark all items of clothing with your child's name and class. This is our only way of matching missing items to the correct child.



We continually encourage children to take care of their belongings. For the younger children we are helping them to be more independent and take responsibility for all items. This includes hanging items on their personal peg and bringing items in from the playground.

If your child brings home an item which does not belong to them, please return it to the school the next day so we can reunite it with its owner.

Toys

We have had a number of children bringing a number of toys from home and then being distracted in class by them. Some children then want to take these items into the playground and have been upset if they have been damaged or have been lost. To assist please do not allow your child to bring toys from home.

P.E. Kit



The class teacher will update See-Saw with your child's P.E. day. Please ensure your child has P.E. Kit on these days.

Please remember this includes alternative indoor shoes. However, we do have a supply of plimsoles, your child can borrow, to ensure all children can participate safely and participate during every PE session.

Make-up, Nail Extensions, False Eyelashes

Some of our older pupils appear keen to experiment with make-up and acrylic nails. P.E. can be challenging and a hazard with false nails. Can we please request that these fashion accessories are kept for weekends and holidays. Your support with this is much appreciated.

Parking

Access to the staff car park, is limited to NAC taxi contract vehicles and permit holders only.



There is a pupil drop off facility using the drop off lane from 08:50am. Children must alight from the vehicle promptly to allow the traffic to flow smoothly. No parking is permitted in the drop off lane at this time.

A number of parents and carers have raised the issue of inconsiderate and dangerous parking on St Kilda Bank and the surrounding streets. If you require to park, please park and stride. Parking facilities are provided at the Broomlands shops or in the streets behind the shops where you can safely walk to and from the school. This can be accessed via Lewis Rise.

Please do not park on any pavements as this also causes an obstruction for pedestrians and parents and carers with children in prams. Your cooperation with this is much appreciated as we are all committed to keeping all our children safe.

The car park will be opened at 3p.m. for any blue badge holders who do not have a parking permit.

No Nuts

Elderbank is a nut free school. No products containing nuts should be brought into school. This includes spreads.

If your child is accidentally sent to school with a snack containing nuts this will be removed and returned at the end of the school day. They will be offered an alternative.

Please do not bring any products containing must (peanuts or tree nuts) into area.

Thank you for helping to keep our children safe.

We thank you for your co-operation as we must protect all children and staff, especially those with nut allergies.

Seesaw

All children across the school and early years have a Seesaw account. This is a valuable tool for the school to share important announcement and updates. There is a facility for parents and carers to message. Messages will only be reviewed during staff working hours. We appreciate that people can be expecting an immediate response, but this is bot the function of Seesaw. Absences must be reported via the school office and not via Seesaw. We appreciate everyone's support of this system.

Community Behaviour

We have been made aware that some pupils are not behaving appropriately in the community. We encourage all pupils to behave outside school as they are expected to do in school. We have contacted our Police Scotland colleagues who are



visiting the school this week to speak to Primary 6 and Primary 7 about good community conduct.



Mobile Phone Reminder

We understand that some children require a mobile phone for safety when travelling to and from school, however they are not required in school. All mobile phones must be switched off and will be stored in a locked cupboard by the teacher. These will be returned at the end of the day. Some children have Smart watches and

Apple watches. All notifications should be turned off during the school day. This is the policy for everyone working and learning at Elderbank.

Parent Council

Our next Parent Council Meeting is at 6:30pm on Wednesday 4th October in the school. The Parent Council are always looking for parents and carers to become involved with their great work. So please pop along if you can. The Parent Council have planned activities for pupils.

No dogs in the school grounds



To ensure the wellbeing of all pupils, dogs are not allowed in the school grounds. Dogs should not be tied up at the gates as this can cause distress for some pupils.

Smoke Free School Grounds
