Allergies

Pupil Attendance

Entry and Exit Arrangements

We have issued detailed plans to ensure all children can enter and exit the school safely. Thank you to everyone who has supported the plans.

Pupils from P4M to P7 are being dismissed from the zig zag path gate towards the rear of the school. Please ensure your child is aware of where they should meet you or if they are to walk home.

Open Afternoon Opportunities

Attached to this newsletter is a list of Open Afternoon Dates for the Mainstream Classes and Early Years. Supported Learning classes will share the dates for each class shortly.

Scooters and Bicycles in school grounds
