- **Steven Forrest**, Pupil Support Assistant who is moving to a new post at Stanley Primary School.



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
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We are deeply grateful for their dedication to our pupils and wish them every success and happiness in the future.

Bump Up Day – Wednesday 18th June (1:30–2:30 p.m.) Current P1-6 Mainstream and EDP pupils



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
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All children within the Mainstream and Enhanced Deaf Provision will meet their new teachers and classmates during this transition session.

- P1–P6 parents/carers will receive details about classes and teachers by **Monday 16th June**
- With three staff members on maternity leave next session, we are welcoming new staff to the Elderbank team
- Individual support needs will be addressed with families as appropriate by our Depute Heads
- Classes have been carefully planned using extensive pupil data, and we have accommodated reasonable requests where possible

Class Organisation 2025/26

To better meet pupil needs, class placements have been revised:

- **Ground Floor:** Supported Learning Classes, Enhanced Deaf Provision Base, Rainbow Room, and both P6 classes
- **First Floor:**
 - Area 1: P1 – P4/3
 - Area 2: P4, P5, P7
- Shared activity space development is underway to reflect the needs of all pupils. This has also included some building alterations and the installation of height appropriate toilet facilities and fobbed access in the new P1 to P4/3 area on the first floor.
- Breaks have been reorganised to allow year groups to socialise together

- Elderbank closes at 1:00p.m.



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
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
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🎄 Christmas Event – Have Your Say!

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
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
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information in a separate document (otherwise this newsletter would be far too long).
