P4P Curriculum Outline - Term 2



Welcome back to P4P with Mrs Preiss.

Literacy

Reading - We will explore a range of fiction and non-fiction texts linked to our topic, 'The Vikings'. We will develop our 'skimming' and 'scanning' skills in order to find key information from a text.

Writing - We will develop the necessary skills to write an information report. In doing so, we will conduct independent research and note-taking before exploring the features of an information report.

Talking and Listening - This term, we will build on skills to allow us to become confident when talking in front of a small audience. We will take part in a Solo Talk about a topic of interest where we will consider volume, clarity and engagement.

Additional Information

Homework will be issued every Monday. Homework can be completed in jotters and returned on a Thursday.

How to help at home:

- Encourage your child to read a variety of texts
- Chant times tables / times table quiz
- Discuss your child's learning with them

Numeracy & Mathematics

This term, we will focus on linking multiplication and division facts. We will explore patterns within times tables and develop our understanding using concrete materials. In addition, we will develop our rapid recall of times table facts through active learning experiences and cooperative learning opportunities such as 'The Thinking Classroom'.

We will also expand our knowledge of 3D shape, focussing on names and properties. We will use this knowledge to identify, construct and label a variety of 3D shapes within our environment.

Finally, we will develop our mental maths skills through weekly 'Number Talks' where we will articulate and demonstrate our findings with our wider class community.

Health and Wellbeing

Our PE days are **Tuesday** and **Friday**. This term, we will be focussing on the different aspects of physical fitness through Rugby and Dance.

As part of Health & Wellbeing, we will be investigating how best to look after our bodies, considering healthy foods and fitness. In addition, we will share and discuss our achievements both in and out of school.

IDL

This term, our topic is 'The Vikings'.

Drama - We will take on different roles considering movement, expression and voice in order to re-create a scene from the past.

Music - We will listen to and compose music from other cultures related to our Vikings topic.

Art & Design - We will take part in a range of Art & Design projects linked to our Vikings topic focussing on shape, form, colour, pattern and texture.
