- If you are collecting your child, please ensure you are **on time**. We are experiencing regular late collections, and we do not have additional staff to supervise children who are not collected promptly.

Car Park and School Safety



The parking situation has become increasingly **dangerous**, and therefore we are **reverting to the permit parking system**.

- There is **no parking** for Early Years or Primary families unless you have a **permit**.
- A **drop-off zone** is available from **8:50 a.m.** This is a drop-and-go system—please drop your child and drive off promptly.
- Members of the Leadership Team will be at the front of the school to help welcome children safely into school.
- Staff overseeing the car park **must not be subjected to any form of abuse**. This will not be tolerated.
- The **speed limit in the car park is 5 mph** to ensure the safety of all pedestrians.
- Blue Badge Holders can access the disabled spaces from 08:55a.m. and 2:55p.m. as all Supported Learning transport will have left the car park at these times.



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Permits will be issued on the 5th January.

If you have a relative or child minder who brings your child to school, please ensure they are aware of the procedures. Thank you for your cooperation and continued support in helping us keep everyone safe.
