Health and Wellbeing

We have gym on a Tuesday and Friday this year so please make sure pupil have a kit in their bag or at school. We will be learning ball skills, which will help, develop coordination, confidence, and control of the pupils' bodies. We will practise simple actions first, like rolling, catching, and gentle throwing, so we can build success step by step. By repeating movements slowly and using clear instructions, they will learn how our hands, eyes, and body can work together.



Literacy



Reading - We will be focusing on core words recognition for some of our pupils and reading comprehension for other learners. Using core words, pupils will develop communication skills by using these words to ask, comment, or make choices. They will acquire skills, such as speaking, signing, or selecting symbols.

Writing - CB7 will be learning to write using Clicker which helps learners practise writing skills in a highly supported way. Learners also develop independent writing skills, as Clicker reduces the physical and cognitive load of writing.

Talking and Listening - We will learn to express our needs and respond to others using visuals, recorded voices and our own voice. These skills will help them take part in conversations in their own way, build confidence, and strengthen social connection.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, we will continue to extend individual targets in number. In CB7 we will be learning to sort objects by colour, size, or shape, which helps them make sense of the world around them. We will be learning to recognise coins and use simple money skills, helping them build confidence in everyday activities like buying snacks or choosing items in a shop.

Interdisciplinary Learning

This term we will learning about Robert Burns, Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day and Easter. To support the learners with this we will use book studies, which will help build important communication and early literacy skills in a gentle, engaging way. By looking at pictures, hearing stories, and talking about characters, your child develops their vocabulary, listening skills, and understanding of emotions and routines. The books we will use are Hairy Maclary from Donaldson Dairy, Love Monster and Maisy Chinese New Year and the story of Easter.



Outdoor Learning



This term we will be focusing on Woodland walks, which will help pupil's build important skills through real-life exploration. As they explore the trees, leaves, and paths, they develop their senses, communication, and confidence. These walks also encourage curiosity, support turn-taking and social interaction, and provide calming opportunities that help with emotional regulation. Please remember to provide welly boots so we can go out in all weather.
