Numeracy

This term, we will extend the range of numbers we are able to work with, primarily focusing on applying these numbers in four operations and problem-solving contexts. We will look to extend number patterns and sequences and will begin to apply our number sense when solving algebraic equations.

In mathematics, Primary 7 will focus on measurement. We will investigate concepts such as mass, volume, capacity, length and area, using formulae to make calculations accurately.

In addition, we will consider real-life contextual links to mathematics through pricing and budgets, using our topic and everyday problems to develop depth of understanding.



Literacy

Reading – We will be analysing a range of non-fiction texts, using them to locate and consider information and to interrogate their purpose. We will develop our critical analysis of information whilst highlighting bias, and the difference between fact and opinion.

Writing – This term, we will be focusing on writing narratives. We will look to include increasingly complex punctuation and grammar skills whilst focusing closely on regularly checking and editing our writing at key points throughout the written process.

Talking and Listening – Primary 7 will extend their knowledge of presenting skills, using pace, volume and engagement strategies to talk effectively. We will create and deliver a structured 'solo talk' on a pupil-led topic as part of our final term.



Topic

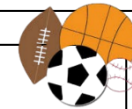
Our class topic this term is the 'FIFA World Cup 2026'. As World Cup fever grips the nation, we will ride the wave of excitement from a Scottish perspective whilst making global links to social, political, economic and environmental issues.

We will investigate the impact of human activity on the environment, the benefits of leisure and tourism for a community or country and compare and contrast values and customs of other countries with Scotland. Also, we will consider what is meant by the term 'society', looking at some of the challenges that many people may face as they live in the world today.

Health and Wellbeing

In P.E., we will apply key skills such as teamwork, communication, adaptability and focus within a range of summer games. We will participate in athletics events, making links to the 2026 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow this summer.

Further, we will look at inclusion and how to identify and understand signs of prejudice and discrimination, considering the support we can each give to others at school. Finally, we will learn about relationships and the physical and emotional changes that take place during puberty.
