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

Potential Industrial Action 26th, 27th and 28th September 2023

You should have received a letter providing information about the planned strike action scheduled for next week, which will impact on the Council's ability to maintain service continuity.

The planned strikes will take place on: Tuesday 26 September 2023 Wednesday 27 September 2023 Thursday 28 September 2023

Strike action is planned for members of UNISON, affecting all schools across North Ayrshire. Staff involved in this industrial action include classroom assistants, early years practitioners, administration staff, technicians, janitors, cleaners and catering staff. These staff groups provide vital support services to education and are essential to ensure the normal operations of the education service. Given the significant number of staff who are members of this trade union, and following an assessment of health and safety and other operational factors, NAC have concluded that it will be necessary to close all North Ayrshire schools for the three days of the intended strike action, if strikes go ahead.

On the days of strike action, where pupils are affected by school closures, packed lunches will be provided to any affected pupils entitled to a free school meal. Families affected by school closures are encouraged to go to their own school (or nearest school) on strike days between 11.00am and 1.00pm where they can collect a packed lunch.

If the strikes go ahead we will provide revision and consolidation learning tasks for pupils to complete at home. I would also direct you to the Home Learning Links tab on Glebe Primary school's website for further activities.

I understand that this industrial action will cause significant disruption to learning for the children and young people of North Ayrshire and that you will have to make alternative arrangements for childcare during the strike days. I am sorry for the inevitable inconvenience this will cause.

We will keep you updated with further information when we know what is happening.

The Ayrshire Roads authorities received joint funding for an in-school active travel project called Trailblazers. Each authority asked 3 schools to pilot the scheme, including Glebe! This is a joint Ayrshire project looking to improve road safety and increase active and sustainable travel to school.

The project uses QR codes located on lamppost banners and signs on commonly used school routes. Families walking to school have the choice to link into the QR codes to access a daily road safety or active travel question.

Each class has received a trailblazers journey record sheet. Children record how they travel to school. Any form of active travel, e.g. walk, ride, scoot, or part active, e.g. park and stride is encouraged.

Our P6 pupils are responsible for Glebe's Active Travel and Road Safety campaigning.

This year, the children wrote speeches and voted for <mark>2 Junior Road Safety</mark> Officers, these are Max Campbell and Frankie Finnigan.

P6 and our JRSOs, supported by Mrs McGinn, will organise and coordinate trailblazer and JRSO competitions and initiatives, as well as promote active and sustainable travel over the year.

Thank you to everyone who managed along to our 1st Learning Café and who completed the parent/carer survey, the feedback was overwhelmingly positive.

Our 2nd Learning Café is on Friday 6th October. The theme is Numeracy.

What is a Learning Café?

This is an opportunity for you to visit your child's class, see their work and participate in a child led activity. Each café will have a different theme. E.g. the first one will be play based.

Who is invited?

Parents, carers, grandparents...it's up to you. However, due to capacity and classroom space we would ask that only one person attends each session (as there are lots over the year). For Health and Safety reasons prams/buggies are not permitted. These can be left in the gym hall.

When?

Friday 6th October Friday 3rd November Friday 12th January Friday 2nd February Friday 1st March Friday 3rd May

Time?

We are splitting the afternoon into 3 sessions in order to reduce the number of people in each class at any one time which should help the sessions run smoothly. Therefore we are arranging session alphabetically by surname.

- 1st session 1.15-1.45pm families with surnames starting with A through to H
- 2nd session 1.45-2.15pm- families with surnames starting with I through to M
- 3rd session 2.15-2.45pm- families with surnames starting with N through to Z

If you have more than one child at Glebe then please choose different sessions for your other children to ensure you get quality time with each of them.

Reporting to Parents/Carers Learning Conversations 23/24

This session there will be two written reports and two Learning Conversations with you, your child and the Class Teacher.

The first of the written reports is an interim report. This will give you an indication of how your child has settled in their new class, how they are learning and their effort in class. You will receive this report on Friday 13th October. The appointment slip for the first Learning Conversation on Wednesday 15th November will be in the same envelope. Please complete the slip and return it to school ASAP in order for the office staff to allocate appointments.

Remember, if you are worried about your child's wellbeing or learning at any time please make an appointment to talk to their Class Teacher, the DHT Mr Wilson or myself.

Attendance and late coming

Glebe Primary works closely with families to support good attendance and good timekeeping. We understand there may be reasons some families experience barriers to attendance. It's our job to work with families to address any barriers.

All schools are asked to track pupils' attendance and late coming and discuss concerns or patterns with families. At Glebe this is done at the end of every month. I will be in touch with families at the start of October to discuss attendance that has fallen below 90% during September or whose children are regularly late.

Thank you for your support in this area.

Please ensure that all items of uniform are labelled with your child's name. This will help us to return any items of lost clothing.

If your child requires medication to be administered during the school day please contact the school office for a medical form.

• Only parents of our younger children (P1-3) should enter the playground at home time for collection. Parents of p4-7 pupils can meet/collect their children just outside the school gates.

Useful Reminders

• Parents should not enter the playground in the morning. P1 pupils now know where to line up and members of staff will be in the playground to supervise the children..

• Please ensure that you child's snacks/lunch do not contain nuts. We currently have several pupils with nut allergies therefore we are a nut free school.
