We look forward to seeing all the egg-citing entries!


GLEBE BRASS ENSEMBLE

SCHOOL LUNCHES AND IPAYIMPACT



Glebe Primary tries to promote a good uptake of school meals. The lunches are healthy and tasty and save families hundreds of pounds over the years as they are free for all children in P1-P5, and as well as to the families in receipt of certain universal credits or in further education.

However, we are finding that less and less families are preordering their child's lunch across the school. The PTs and I covered a variety of classes last week due and we witnessed firsthand the difficulties with ordering lunches in school with our connectivity issues. In some classes registration and lunch, which are both completed online, took almost 40 minutes. That is 40 minutes where the teacher is not teaching or supporting pupils with learning.

All parents/carers have been issued with log in details to order lunch. Ordering lunch is the responsibility of the parent/carer and we are pleading with families to take 5 minutes on a Sunday or an evening and order your child's lunch with them present. This would also reduce the number of children who refuse to order lunch in class claiming they don't like anything!

Thank you to the families who do already pre-order.



MOBILE PHONES AT SCHOOL

We are asking for parent/carer support to discourage mobile phones at school.

We have noticed a large increase in the number of children bringing their mobile phones and smartwatches to school, including from pupils in P3 and P4!

For security and safeguarding reasons all phones have to be handed in and collected from the school office before 9am and after 3pm, and these devices have to be kept in a secure place. We are finding it difficult to store more than 100 mobile phones!

We understand parents/carers are under pressure to allow the young people to bring their phone to school. I'm sure you are told all their friends have their phones at school, however we would strongly discourage this practice where possible unless you are concerned for their safety travelling to/from school.

If your child can leave their phone at home that would be appreciated.
