# **Learning Conversations**

We are looking forward to welcoming parents to our learning conversations on either Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> November or Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> November. All parents have been offered an appointment. If you have not yet managed to make one then please call the office and we will try to assist. During the evening your child's teacher will discuss your child's progress and you will have an opportunity to look through their jotters. The book fayre will be in the library and you are welcome to purchase books (cash only). The Primary 7 helpers will be around to assist you and direct you to classes. They will also have QR codes to link to a survey which we would be very grateful for you to complete. If they miss you then don't worry as there will be posters with QR codes around the school.

#### The World of Work

Over the next few weeks all children will be learning about the world of work and metaskills development. You will have received a letter inviting you to talk about your job role, if you wish. We aim to expose our children to the many vast opportunities available to them when they leave school and you are never too young to be inspired or spark a dream.

#### **Attendance and Late Comings**

The Scottish Government is currently running a campaign raising awareness of the impact of poor attendance in Scottish schools. The campaign recognises that many families face complex challenges, from mental health and social pressures. Parents told the government they often feel blamed or isolated; this campaign focuses on understanding, support, and practical help. School absenteeism remains a significant challenge across schools and it impacts a child's wellbeing, learning and attainment. If you are struggling with this or lateness please contact the school to discuss and find out how we can help. Lateness has a huge impact too with many children missing important parts of lessons or feeling embarrassed walking into a class late. You can watch the school attendance video here

- A child with 95% attendance across a whole school year (August to June) will have missed around 60 lessons.
- A child with 85% attendance will have missed around 250 lessons.
- A Child with an average of 80% attendance over five school years will actually have missed a whole year of school.

You will have received your child's current attendance/ late comings with your child's report. North Ayrshire Council requires schools to make contact with families whose attendance is low. Please understand that if I phone it is not judgemental but to understand and be supportive to encourage your child to attend school.
