Attendance and Late Coming

We are continuing to focus on improving attendance and late coming across the school. Every school day counts and we want to work with families who experience barriers to attendance. Head Teachers have to complete monthly attendance reports, these are not meant to cause distress and I understand children do get sick, however we need to work together to ensure there are no unnecessary absences which then impact on your child's education and attainment. We also ask for your support to get children to school on time as children who are regularly late miss vital chunks of leaning every day. We appreciate the many families who are very supportive of the school's work in these areas.
