








School Values

FESTIVALS AROUND THE WORLD





GROWTH & CHANGES




Arran class have been learning about growth and changes through developing an awareness of our bodies and developing an understanding of physical changes.

The pupils looked at the human body, looking after their body and the changes that take place as they grow. All pupils participated in selecting/naming/signing a variety of body parts using symbols which was then reinforced during Yogacise sessions.

Visits to the public library involved selecting and looking at non-fiction books about the human body. ICT was used to find out about body facts and how best to look after our bodies. Pupils enjoyed participating in a table top game to develop an awareness of the sequence of key growth stages from birth onwards.

Celebrating Success As you know we have made changes to our Reporting and Annual Review procedures this session.



We are keen to ensure that parents/carers are happy about the new formats and feel that they are fully involved in planning for their child or young person's education.


Thank you to all those parents/carers who have already provided some feedback about the layout and information within the Termly Report.

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MAKATON TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PARENTS, CARERS & STAFF

As part of a bid to the Scottish Government, we secured funding to train staff from Haysholm School and James McFarlane School in a number of communication approaches.

A programme of Foundation Makaton Training is well underway and from April – June some selected staff will have the opportunity to participate in Enhancement Workshops. The aim is that eventually we will have a few staff trained to Regional Tutor level.

We are very aware that due to family circumstances it is not always easy to come along to the school or to other venues for Makaton Basic Training during the school day. Therefore, we have purchased Makaton distance learning resources for parents/carers to borrow so that they can develop their skills at home. 
PUPIL EQUITY FUNDING FROM THE SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT




The Pupil Equity Funding is additional funding allocated directly to schools and targeted at closing the poverty related attainment gap. The Scottish Government has committed to this funding as part of the Scottish Attainment Challenge Programme from 2017-18. The Pupil Equity Funding forms part of

the £750m Attainment Scotland Fund.

Haysholm School will secure £22,800 within next year's budget to deliver targeted support to our children and young people. This has been included as an agenda item in the forthcoming Parent Council Meeting on Thursday 23 February. I am keen to consult and collaborate with parents, staff and partners as to how best to utilise the funding to ensure impact and best outcomes for our learners.













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MUSIC THERAPY


