Programme

We are currently 75 weeks through the 92 week build programme and the works are currently on schedule. Despite the continuing poor weather, progress on the site has been good. Internal works have progressed with four of the floor areas completed and now having the mechanical and electrical installations being tested and commissioned. It will be necessary to undertake some late night working up to 10pm w/c 20 November to coordinate essential installation works. These works are restricted to the inside of the building and are quiet activities. Aerial photographs below show the extent of progress externally, these and the internal works are as follows:

Works carried out over the preceding month:

- Secondary block being locked-off for final snagging
- Mechanical and electrical 3rd fix works
- Decoration throughout the building
- o Joiner installing doors, cills, etc.
- Completion of mains water and electrical supplies
- Street lighting
- Completion of sports pitch and soft landscaping

Works planned over the next four weeks include:

- Completion of suspended ceiling and flooring installation
- o Reception desks and acoustic panel installation
- Final decoration
- Vinyl, carpet and timber sports flooring installation
- Connection of the heating to the building
- o Lighting control boxes being commissioned which will facilitate turning off the lights at night
- IPS units and sanitary ware to toilets
- Lift installation completion
- Surfacing works and hard landscaping
