Spelling

Reading & Writing

You may select your presentation style to suit each activity: eg written, typed, PowerPoint, Sway Slideshow, all of which should reflect the level of description and detail we have been improving and developing throughout the year.

Talking and Listening

In term 4 we will be focussing on Personal Talks. You will be asked to talk for 4 minutes on a subject of your choice. eg A favourite holiday, hobby, book, or pet ...

Please prepare a script or talk notes and practice at home. You may like to include a PowerPoint, props, photos, maps etc.

You should aim to focus on: the appropriate content and detail of your talk, in addition to Volume, Clarity, Pace, gw14

Maths

We will be moving onto aspects of time and money so we suggest that you familiarise yourself with skills you have covered in P4 and progress further using the online activities.

Science and Social Studies

You might enjoy creating a personal project, using online resources, to demonstrate your understanding and research skills about one (or more) of the topics, we have covered this year. – Or perhaps a subject of your own choosing. Again this may be typed, written or in PowerPoint form, in your own words.

Please include a title, and give each new section a subheading.

Write in clearly structured and detailed paragraphs and include a variety of illustrations, charts, maps, tables, as appropriate.

Include a section, which states the sources of the information you have used (websites).
