Welcome to our Termly Information

Session: 2025-2026

Literacy

This term, we will continue to build on the children's reading and comprehension skills. Pupils will be developing their ability to scan texts to find key information and use this to answer questions, helping them to better understand what they have read. We will also encourage children to talk about texts, share their ideas and begin to explain their thinking. In writing, we will focus on creating simple stories with a clear beginning, middle and end. Children will be supported to plan their ideas before writing and to read back over their work to make improvements. We will introduce a range of tools to make writing more interesting, including connectives (e.g. *and*, *but*, *because*) and different sentence openers. There will be a continued focus on using capital letters, full stops and spacing correctly. For listening and talking, children will prepare and present a short personal talk about their favourite activity. This will help to build confidence when speaking in front of others. Pupils will also take part in a variety of talking and listening activities, including group discussions and outdoor learning tasks.

Health & Wellbeing

This term, we will be learning about how to look after our bodies and minds. Children will explore the importance of a healthy lifestyle, including making good choices around diet, getting enough rest and sleep, and staying active. We will also discuss ways to recognise and talk about our feelings, helping children to understand themselves and others. Through a range of activities, pupils will continue to develop skills in working together, showing kindness and respect, and building positive relationships within the class. In Physical Education, children will take part in athletics, tennis and outdoor games. We will also be preparing for Sports Day!

Social Studies

This term, our learning will focus on Fairtrade, helping children to develop an understanding of how people and communities around the world are connected. Pupils will explore where everyday foods and products come from and begin to understand the journey they take before reaching us. Through discussions and activities, children will learn about the importance of fairness, making responsible choices and how buying Fairtrade products can support farmers and workers in other countries. We will encourage pupils to share their thoughts and make links to their own lives, helping them to develop an early awareness of global citizenship and sustainability.

Maths & Numeracy

This term, we will continue to build confidence across a range of practical maths activities. Children will explore measurement, including length, weight and capacity, using everyday objects, and will also be introduced to the idea of area. We will develop understanding of patterns and number sequences, as well as explore symmetry and direction through a variety of hands-on tasks. In data handling, children will collect information in different ways and present it using charts and graphs. They will begin to read and interpret this data to answer simple questions. Throughout all learning, children will be encouraged to explain their thinking and apply their maths skills in real-life contexts.

STEM

This term, our learning will focus on living things. Children will learn to identify the difference between living and non-living things and begin to understand what all living things need to survive. We will carry out simple experiments to explore what plants need to grow, encouraging children to observe and talk about changes over time. Pupils will also be introduced to simple food chains, helping them understand how living things depend on each other.

Modern Languages

This term, children will continue to develop their French through fun and interactive activities such as songs, games and simple conversations. We will build on familiar vocabulary, including greetings, numbers and colours, and begin to use these in short phrases. Children will also practise listening carefully and responding to simple instructions in French.

Expressive Arts

This term, children will take part in a range of creative activities across art, drama and music. In art, pupils will explore patterns through printing and use a variety of materials, including natural objects, as well as developing observational drawing skills outdoors. In drama, children will build confidence by taking on different roles and acting out familiar stories. In music, pupils will explore sound and rhythm by creating their own simple musical instruments through hands-on activities.

RME

This term, we will be learning about the story of Joseph within Christianity. This links to our upcoming school show, and children will enjoy exploring the story, characters and key events. Through this, pupils will learn about important values such as kindness, forgiveness and resilience. There will be opportunities for discussion, storytelling and simple role play to help bring the story to life and support understanding.

Digital Technologies

This term, children will begin developing their digital skills through simple coding activities. Using visual programming tools and our class robot, Marty, pupils will learn how to give instructions and solve simple problems. These activities will help children develop confidence in using technology, while encouraging logical thinking and creativity.

Useful Additional Information

Please continue to check Seesaw regularly for updates and to see your child's learning. Children will be spending more time learning outdoors this term, so please ensure your child brings a sunhat and/or comes to school wearing sunscreen on sunny days. We are also looking forward to our school trip to Kelvingrove Museum in June, which will be a great opportunity to support our learning in a real-life context.
