OUR DUTY TO PROTECT

All Staff at Lawthorn Primary School &
Early Years Class have a legal
responsibility to protect and safeguard
the children within our care.

It is the responsibility of all staff to report any child protection or safeguarding concerns to the child protection coordinator.

The child protection coordinator at Lawthorn Primary School is Miss S.

Grossart, Head Teacher.

The child protection coordinator has a legal responsibility to report any child protection or safeguarding concerns to Social Services. Parents will be alerted based on advice given from Social Work.



HOW WE RESPOND TO CONCERNS

- Member of staff records any concerns
- Member of Staff reports concerns to the Child Protection coordinator
- Child Protection coordinator discusses concerns with staff
- Child Protection coordinator contacts Social Services to discuss next steps
- Social Services make a decision on whether the reported concern is child protection or safeguarding and next steps are agreed with the child protection coordinator



HOW YOU CAN HELP

Please ensure you report all instances of absence

Reporting accidents: please let us know if your child has had an accident resulting in significant injuries

Open communication: tell us about your child and his/her needs

Report any concerns to the child protection coordinator.
