


World Book Day

Healthy Snack Provision Update

This session, schools across North Ayrshire received funding for additional food provisions. In primary schools, this funding was used to provide a healthy snack at break time, while secondary schools introduced the Winter Warmer Breakfast. Both of these initiatives were temporary and will come to an end on Friday, 28th March 2025.

Head lice

Head lice can be a common problem, particularly among school children aged 4-11. They are largely harmless and difficult to spot, however symptoms include an itchy scalp, a rash at the back of the neck and feeling as though something is moving in the hair.

We recommend that you check your child's head regularly and should your child have head lice, treatments can be sought at your local pharmacy.





Mobile Phones in School

To avoid damage and inappropriate use, we kindly ask that pupils do not bring mobile phones into school. If you feel it is essential for your child to have their phone, please let us know. In such cases, children will be asked to leave their mobile phone at the school office for safekeeping during school hours.

School Car Park Safety

To ensure the safety of our children, we kindly ask all parents and carers to use our school car park safely. Please do not park in the 'drop-off' bay, as this should only be used for those who do not need to leave their car. This will help keep traffic flowing smoothly and prevent unnecessary congestion.
