NACEPS Professional Learning Offer 2025 - 26

North Ayrshire Educational Psychology Service's 25 26 professional learning offer has been developed taking into consideration local authority and national education priorities. With a focus on implementation to ensure impact, the Educational Psychology Service aims to work with partners to deliver professional learning which is specific to individual context and needs. The following table outlines key areas in which we can offer training and coaching.

Universal Emotion Coaching Expectations and Consequences Supporting Classroom Environments Targeted Building on Positive Relationships - supporting adult presence Intensive Positive Behaviour Support Planning	This offer is being developed in line with the Supporting Relationships and Behaviour Steering group. Educational Psychology Services will provide coaching and capacity-building for staff across universal, targeted, and intensive levels. Drawing on psychological theory and an understanding of neurodiversity, we aim to strengthen relational practice and enhance staff confidence in supporting learners who experience emotional and behavioural dysregulation to foster emotionally safe environments that enable learners to thrive.
Attendance	
Staged Approach to supporting attendance Part 1) Context and universal approaches Part 2) Early Intervention including risk and resilience factors Part 3) Targeted supports	This professional learning has three sections. Parts 1 and 2 are suitable for all teaching staff, Part 3 is more targeted support for ASN co-ordinators/DHTs etc. Part 1 looks at both the national and local context in terms of attendance as well as analysis of school data and whole school universal approaches. Part 2 highlights what the research tells us about the importance of early intervention with attendance and shares tools to support exploration of risk and resilience factors at individual, family and school levels. Part 3 explores more targeted supports for individuals and introduces tools and resources to support schools with collaborative planning, assessment and intervention.
