Five Point Activities

Then later, come back to the third column and see if you can correctly unscramble your words in your third column without looking at the first column!</p>	<p>Other Handed</p> <p>If you are right handed, right your words with your left hand. If you are left handed, write your words with your right hand!</p>	<p>Secret Agent</p> <p>Write the alphabet from A to Z on your paper. Then go back and create a symbol for each letter. Use your secret code to spell out your words.</p>

Remember the last word in each line must rhyme. Write your spelling word first, then write your jingle. Underline the spelling word in each jingle</p> <p>Green: See the big <u>green</u> frog.
