- Plan an imaginary meal from start to finish by writing a recipe, including ingredients, and give your new dish a name. Can you draw a picture of it too? (extra points!)
- Teach us about something you love or know a lot about. Write a lesson plan telling an (imaginary) class about your subject. What will you teach us about? Make it interesting! Include pictures or anything else you think would be fun.
- Be creative! Be artistic! Make, draw, or invent something. Find the objects yourself, and use your imagination. It could be a painting, a drawing, a model, or a sculpture. Anything's possible....
- Write a biography for an imaginary person. Tell us about them - their name, life, family, job and activities. What do they enjoy doing? Make it as unique as possible and draw a picture of them!
- Make up five interesting questions to ask someone in an interview. Find someone (in your house!) to interview and ask your questions. Write down the interview and send it to us.
- Be a good citizen and then tell us about what you did. What does being a good citizen mean to you? Write down your answers and tell us about your challenge. Why did you choose it?
- Choose an animal, a place, or a plant. Learn EVERYTHING you can about that thing, and write about what you learned, using pictures if you need to. What will YOU choose? Make it interesting!
- Go to Youtube and search for our channel NA Libraries Vision. When you are there, watch a video, follow the instructions and make an origami rabbit, frog or bee. Take a picture and send it to us!
- Share a story or poem with someone special in your house, (can even be a pet or a bear!) Tell us what you read, and why. Send a picture, if you can.
- Look up the definition of an 'acrostic poem' online, or in a dictionary. Write an acrostic poem either for your own name OR using the word LOCKDOWN. Send us the results!
