Research highlights the importance of 'play' in developing critical thinking and problem solving skills which are essential to meeting the growing needs of our young people to help equip them with the skills to succeed in life. Through 'play' children are building a range of skills across the curriculum. The P1-P3 Learning Zone is an incredible area which promotes free 'play' for our little ones. P4-P7 will incorporate 'play' in a number of different ways which might include 'Tinker other Trays' and investigative imaginative opportunities. During session, you will be invited to come along and join us for a 'play' and learn more about the theory behind this pedagogy.

Children should come to school on those days suitably dressed to take part wearing navy blue/grey or black shorts/leggings or joggers, plain white or blue t-shirt/polo shirt and bring indoor gym shoes without black soles to avoid marking the gym hall floor. Please ensure no jewellery is worn on PE days. If ear piercings cannot be removed, we require earrings are covered with medical tape to prevent injury. Long hair should also be tied back, or a bobble provided to do this prior to the PE session.

#### P6/7 MUSIC TUITION

A music specialist will attend every Monday to deliver woodwind lessons to P6/7 children as part of the North Ayrshire Music Tuition Service.

#### FLU IMMUNISATIONS

Flu immunisations will take place on 3<sup>rd</sup> October this year, children have been issued with consent forms which should be completed and returned to school.

#### ROAD SAFETY

Please continue to ensure we park in a safe

manner around the road accessing the school. Please note that dropping children off in the



school car park from 8.45am - 9am and collecting children from the school car park at 3pm is not permitted and parking on the yellow zigzag lines is not permitted. This is to make the area as safe as possible for all of our children and families, we thank you for your continued support in this matter.

#### WE ARE A TRAILBLAZING SCHOOL!

Trailblazers are parents, pupils and school staff who want to improve children's health, wellbeing and safety helping them to walk, cycle or



scoot to and from school and Nursery.

The Trailblazer scheme involves signs that are placed along routes to school highlighting the time it takes to walk to school from that point. This will be either 5 or 10 minutes. If you live a long distance from the school, you can still drive to a safe location near a sign and walk, cycle or scoot from there.

Along the route, parents/carers can scan the Trailblazer QR codes on lampposts that will take you to a daily message, question or challenge from the pony, Blaze. You only need to scan one code per day.

Please note: The website will never ask you for personal details or to enter any information.

#### Skelmorlie Pupil Council

One of the ways in which children can have their say and make sure that their views and ideas are listened to is through the **Pupil** Council.

#### What is a Pupil Council?

A pupil council:

- gives our children the chance to tell teachers, staff parents and other children their ideas and views
- represents each class in the school
- meets regularly to talk about important school issues and projects
- puts forward the class views at council meetings
- take forward the views of the very young classes, who may find it difficult to put forward their opinions.

#### Eco Committee

What does the Eco Committee do?

The Eco Committee meet regularly to think of ways to care for the environment and the world around us. Pupils in the Eco Committee are passionate about ways in which they can make a difference. The Eco Team has helped us to achieve the Eco-Schools Green Flag Award. As a team we have three main areas that we are developing in school litter, waste and school grounds. The Eco group explore the importance of sustainability and will develop our raised beds to provide food for our community.

#### Rights Respecting Schools Committee

What is a Rights Respecting School?
