to be managed by staff, allowing for a quieter, more sensory-friendly environment.

EARLY YEARS CLASS

Please find above the PE days for Session 25/26. Children should come to school on those days suitably dressed to take part wearing navy blue/black or grey shorts/leggings or joggers, and a plain white or blue T-shirt or polo-shirt. It is very important that the children have a change of shoes as no outdoor footwear is permitted during PE to avoid damaging the gym hall floor. Please insure no jewellery is worn on PE days. If ear piercings cannot be removed, we require earring are covered with medical tape to prevent injury. Long hair should also be tied back, or a bobble provided to do this prior

to the PE session. Please ensure children do not wear false nails.

FLU IMMUNISATIONS

Flu immunisations will take place on Tuesday 4th November this year, children have been issued with consent forms which should be completed and returned to school.

ROAD SAFETY

Please continue to ensure we park in a safe manner around the road accessing the school. Please note that dropping children off in the school car park from 8.45am - 9am and collecting children from the school car park at 3pm is not permitted, nor is parking on the yellow zigzag lines. This is to make sure the area is as safe as possible for all of our children and families and we thank you for your continued support in this matter. Our newly appointed Junior road Safety Officers will be responsible for sharing lots of information with our learners and school community and creating exciting activities to highlight the importance of Road Safety - watch this space!



SCHOOL COMMUNITY GROUPS

In Skelmorlie Primary School, our children have an important part to play in making decisions about the life and work of the school. Every child in our school is involved in one of our Committees - The Pupil Council, Eco Committee, Rights Respecting Schools Committee and, new for this session, Library Committee. Committee meetings will be held twice a term where actions are agreed with the children. Below we have outlined a little more information on each committee:

Skelmorlie Pupil Council

One of the ways in which children can have their say and make sure that their views and ideas are listened to is through the Pupil Council.

What is a Pupil Council?

A pupil council:

- Gives our children the chance to tell teachers, staff, parents and other children their ideas and views
- Represents each class in the school
- Meets regularly to talk about important school issues and projects
- Puts forward the class views at council meetings
- Take forward the views of the very young classes, who may find it difficult to put forward their opinions.

Eco Committee

What does the Eco Committee do?

The Eco Committee meet regularly to think of ways to care for the environment and the world around us. Pupils in the Eco Committee are passionate about ways in which they can make a difference. The Eco Team has helped us to achieve the Eco-Schools Green Flag award and the Eco Committee will be working hard to apply for reaccreditation.

Rights Respecting Schools

What is a Rights Respecting Schools Committee?

The UNICEF UK Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA) is based on principles of equality, dignity, respect, non-discrimination and participation. The RRSA seeks to put the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child at the heart of a school's ethos and culture to improve well-being and develop every child's talents and abilities to their full potential. A rights-respecting school is a community where children's rights are learned, taught, practised, respected, protected and promoted. Young people and the school community learn about children's rights by putting them into practice every day.

<u>Library Committee</u>

We're excited to be starting a Library Committee this session. Which will focus on promoting a love of reading across the school. They'll be responsible for making sure the library is a great place for everyone. This means they will help to keep the shelves tidy, making it easy to find books. They'll also get to organise whole school reading activities, like reading competitions or special story times and organising World Book Day. Most importantly, the committee will gather ideas from their classmates about what new books we should buy! They'll be the voice of the students, helping to make our library the very best it can be.

LIBRARY VISITS

Each term the children visit the local library and participate in a topic related activity as well as having time to enjoy the wide range of books.



SEESAW

Again, please note that all classes & EYC will be using SeeSaw as a platform for effective communication with families. This term, we had temporarily paused the use of SeeSaw across the primary school while we rolled out the new Parents Portal system.



To ensure a smooth transition and compliance across all our digital platforms, we needed to take some time to review and acquire the

appropriate permissions, particularly concerning the sharing of photographs and videos of children. We want to make sure we are meeting all regulatory requirements as we implement the new portal alongside our existing tools.

Please do not worry! This was a very shortterm measure and we plan for SeeSaw to be back up and running imminently. Please keep an eye out for your child's individual SeeSaw learning code that will be coming home in your child's school bag very soon. These codes will allow you to reconnect with your child's class on the platform once the necessary permissions and system updates are complete.

PARENTS PORTAL

Parentsportal.scot is a new digital service to help improve information-sharing between parents and carers and schools by providing direct communication to parents and carers through a growing suite of online services, thus replacing the traditional "schoolbag run". Through parentsportal.scot, parents and carers will be able to grant permissions for school trips, view attendance, complete the annual data check and apply for NEC cards for free bus travel, to name but a few. We encourage anyone who has not signed up to parentsportal to do so to help streamline communication between home and school.

myHappymind

We're thrilled to introduce a new whole-school resource called myHappymind to all our primary learners! This fantastic program is designed to proactively promote positive mental health and wellbeing across the school. Your children will be learning about the science of the brain in an engaging way, giving them practical strategies and tools to help them navigate and manage their emotions effectively.
