PUPIL ENTRY AND EXIT

Primary 1/2/3 pupils line up in the infant playground.

P4/5/6/7 line up in the upper playground.

There is staff rota to collect lines each morning, after break and lunch.

At the end of the school day P1/2/3 pupils are released to parents/carers who enter the infant playground.

P4/5/6/7 pupils leave via the upper playground on their own.

SCHOOL REWARD SYSTEM

We have four houses in our school.

Pupils earn tokens that are linked to our school values and place them into the token collector located near the school office. Please familiarise yourself with the policy and use this system as appropriate whilst working with us.

Our Positive Relationships Policy is key to ensuring we get it right for our pupils. We celebrate positive behaviour and effort across all classes. We have restorative conversations with pupils when required, to ensure they understand the results of their actions, which will help them make improved decisions in the future.

STUDENT GUIDANCE

WORKING HOURS

Students are asked to attend school from 8.30am until 4pm.

These hours support the daily set up and end of day tasks/marking etc.

If you are unwell and unable to attend placement you must call 01294 211651 to speak to the Head Teacher.

We ask that you prioritise timekeeping and if you are going to be late you let us know as soon as possible.

CHILD PROTECTION

Child protection is paramount within Springside Primary and EYC. If you have any concerns about a child they must be reported **immediately** to Gordon Wilson who is our Child Protection Co-Ordinator.

Please ensure you read the child protection policy handbook on arrival at the school.

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones can be used within your own private time however they must not be used in the classroom.

Phone must be kept with your personal belongings and not on you when you are working with pupils.

CONFIDENTIALITY

All information shared at Springside Primary in relation to children and families must not be shared. It is essential that you regard all information as confidential. Any breach of confidentiality will be treated seriously and appropriate action in line with North Ayrshire Council's policy and procedures will be followed and implemented.

FIRE EVACUATION

On your first visit to the primary school, please familiarise yourself with the fire evacuation procedures. Ensure you know how you would evacuate safely from each room in the building and where the muster point is.

DRESS CODE

We kindly ask that you dress in a comfortable, professional manner. The primary curriculum can be messy so please don't wear anything that you will be upset getting covered in chalk/paint etc.

If you are unsure about what to wear please speak to your allocated mentor.
