
Health and Wellbeing/Expressive Arts:

Numeracy/Maths:



Homework will be distributed weekly, and your support with completion of this is greatly appreciated. Children should access Sumdog regularly to develop their speed and agility with mental maths and to revise concepts.

Interdisciplinary Learning:

Our final topic, 'The Titanic' will provide a rich stimulus for varied cross curricular learning, as well as the opportunity for an amazing trip to Belfast on 29th May! This will include research and the creation of a timeline using PowerPoint, a debate around the fairness of the 'women and children first' evacuation plan, the technological impact of Titanic and creative artwork and writing.

Literacy:

For reading, children will develop their reading skills through a combination of tasks related to PM-levelled non-fiction texts, and other cross-curricular reading material.

This term, our main PM Writing focus will be 'Discussion' writing, consolidating our ability to construct paragraphs and arguments using topic sentences, related statements and evidence, as well as persuasive vocabulary. We will learn how to debate issues as a part of this writing unit, exploring a range of interesting topics throughout the process.

Spelling will continue to be taken from the 'Single Word Spelling Test' lists. We will be using a range of Active Spelling strategies to practise these words and will be learning to identify the spelling rules that help us decode and spell unfamiliar/tricky words.

Science:











Religious Education:

This term, our R.E. will recap the theme of living and loving like Jesus as we prepare to transition to Largs Academy – ensuring that we shine the light of our compassion, skills and talents to take the best versions of ourselves into our next chapter. We will also deepen our understanding of the Resurrection and Ascension of our Lord.

Within Science, we will continue to explore the structure and function of sensory organs (eyes, ears, skin) to understand how the body reacts to various conditions.

In addition, we will conduct a range of experiments related to our Titanic topic, and complete a STEAM challenge alongside Primary 5.
