Numeracy

The children will continue to develop their mental maths skills using number talks.

They will be extending their number skills when working on money problems and will be using their knowledge of number facts to solve problems where an unknown value is represented by a symbol or letter (algebra).

We will revisit 2D/3D shapes and create tiling patterns as part of our Christmas activities.
