Creating a Bibliography

A Bibliography should contain all of the sources that you have cited(quotes and ideas that are not your own) as well as any sources that you have read during your research.

It should be on a separate page at the end of your essay/report. The list of resources should be in alphabetical order by authors' surname. If a source doesn't have an author/editor and is produced by an organisation (e.g BBC, Scottish Government) rather than an individual, you'd use this instead of a name.

What details do I include in my Bibliography?

Book

Author, A (year of publication) Book' Title, Place of publication: Publisher

e.g Mitton, J (2016) *Moon* (Eyewitness) London: Dorling Kindersley Spilsbury, L & Spilsbury, R (2018) *Light and sound* (Essential Physical Science) London, Raintree

Web sources

Author, A (year of publication/update) title. Available from: URL (Accessed: date)

e.g Ball, J (2017) *Canine virus threatens Siberian tiger*. Available from: <u>www.bbc.co.uk/news/science-environment-24535799</u> (Accessed 21st January 2020) Richard, D (2018) *Ten freaky forces of nature*. Available from: <u>http://kids.nationalgeographic.co.uk/kids/stories/spacescience/freaky-forces-of-nature</u> (Accessed 24th January 2020)

Journal/Newspaper Article
