Literacy

Reading

This term, we will focus on developing our comprehension skills. Our class novel is 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty. We will also be reading a range of non-fiction texts to develop our research skills. We have been invited to Dalry Library to meet with a local author as part of our Book Week Scotland activities.

Writing

This term we will begin Talk for Writing. Pupils will develop skills to improve their writing by building their vocabulary and understanding of text structures through storytelling, role-play and story mapping. Our writing will be closely linked to our topic.

Talking and Listening

Children will participate in a range of activities to encourage curiosity and generate questions to develop questioning skills. They will present their research on our topic through group work and class presentations.

Religious Education

We will learn more about the Holy Spirit, and how we share our talents to benefit others, including within our Faith Community. At the All Saints Mass, P6 will enroll onto the Faith Award Program. As we prepare to move into the season of Advent, we will be learning how God reveals himself through the actions of Jesus. We will learn about Jesus through the Gospel of Matthew.

Health and Wellbeing

<u>P.E</u>

Maths and Numeracy

In Numeracy this term, we will reinforce number patterns with a focus on speed and accuracy, for example, pairs of numbers that equal 100. We will also be building the 6 and 9 times tables using our knowledge of the 3 times table. Our Maths focus will be about identifying angles, triangles, and the properties of regular and irregular 2D and 3D Shapes. Later on, we will move onto Money, understanding the terms of profit & loss, and using our knowledge of mental maths to problem solve.

Topic

Our topic this term is The Victorians. What was life really like for people in Victorian Britain? How did Victorian inventions and ideas change the world, and shape our lives today? Through the context of our class novel, we will compare our lives to children growing up in Victorian London. We may even experience first hand what it was like to be a child in the 1800.
