Literacy



Reading

This class novel to begin this term is another fabulous story by Roald Dahl. 'George and his Marvellous Medicine' was voted by pupils as the next novel they wanted to explore. Pupils will engage with linked activities (including drama) to support their literacy development with the novel, as well as with their own reading books. They will also continue to be encouraged to read for enjoyment with their own personal choice of book.

Writing (including Talking and Listening)

Pupils have been engaging well with our new writing framework 'Talk for Writing'. They are learning and retelling texts, enabling them to internalise language structures and sequences, before creating their own texts independently. We are beginning the year, focusing on narratives.

Pupils will also be learning Scottish vocabulary as part of our topic, enabling them to create texts that include Scots language as well as learning songs and poetry.



Modern Languages

The class are enjoying developing their Spanish vocabulary, and will continue being taught this term by Miss Burke. They will begin this term learning vocabulary related to family as well as talking about themselves.

It is term 3 already and year 2026 has begun! P3/4 has a busy January to begin the year, especially as we have our Celebration of Learning, a Scottish Assembly and have a small role to play in the P7's Burns Supper.

Pupils will also collect, display and interpret information using a variety of graphs and charts in 'Information Handling'.



Topic

Pupils will complete Scientists topic and prepare for their Celebration of Learning at the end of month. They will also begin their new topic 'Scottish Myths and Legends' in which they will learn about many myths in Scotland including Nessie, the Kelpies and the Selkies. The topic will enable them to learn more about geographical, historical and cultural aspects of Scotland as well as providing opportunities for them to be individually creative.
