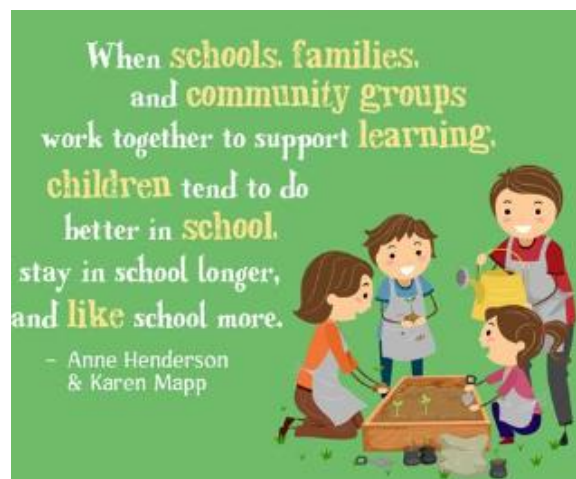
FAMILY LEARNING NEWS

Parents' Night Target Talks



From 28th September by phone



From the week beginning 28th September until 8th October class teachers will call you to discuss your child's progress and targets. Prior to this your child and their teacher will have met to discuss targets for Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing.

On 25th September you will receive your child's target record sheet and an appointment slip detailing the date and time for your phone call. Days and times will vary from class to class, as teachers will call you from their homes at a time that is convenient for them. If you do not reply when the teacher calls they will re-schedule another appointment time. Should the time you receive be unsuitable please contact the class teacher to re-schedule.

After the phone call we would like you and your child to comment on the targets set and then return the Target record sheet (and Staged Intervention plan if you have one) to school as soon as possible. We will make a copy for your child to keep in school and return the original to you after

Remember: Do not wait until the next Parents' Night if you have anything you want to discuss. Just call the office and make an appointment with the class teacher or a member of the leadership team.

Gaelic Medium Education

We are delighted to welcome Gaelic Medium Education to Whitehirst Park Primary. You may be wondering what this means so here is some information:

North Ayrshire Council is committed to the promotion and support of Gaelic Medium Education. Whitehirst Park Primary is the base for North Ayrshire Gaelic Provision and started in August 2020 with a Primary 1/2 class.

The pupils in our Gaelic Medium Class have 'total immersion' in Gaelic for the first three years of Primary. The next stage of learning in Gaelic Medium Education is the 'immersion phase' where the curriculum in its entirety continues to be taught through the medium of Gaelic. Children should then have a secure base in Gaelic language to transfer to developing reading and writing skills in English Language and to learn at a quicker pace across the curricular areas and contexts. Gaelic Medium pupils will leave Whitehirst Park Primary School with the advantage of having become proficient in two languages, Gaelic and English.

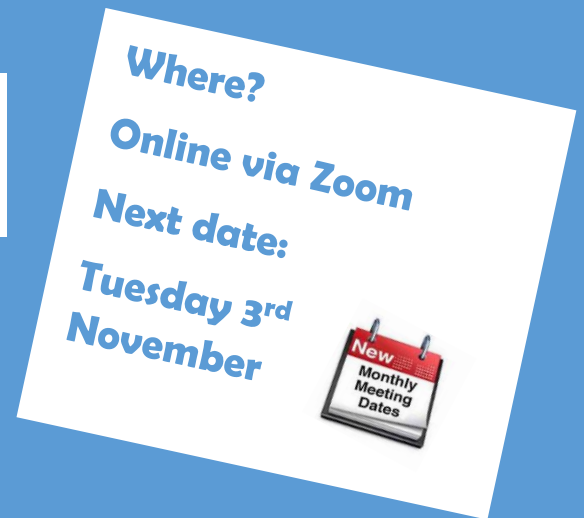

- Investigate availability of grant funding for school based activities



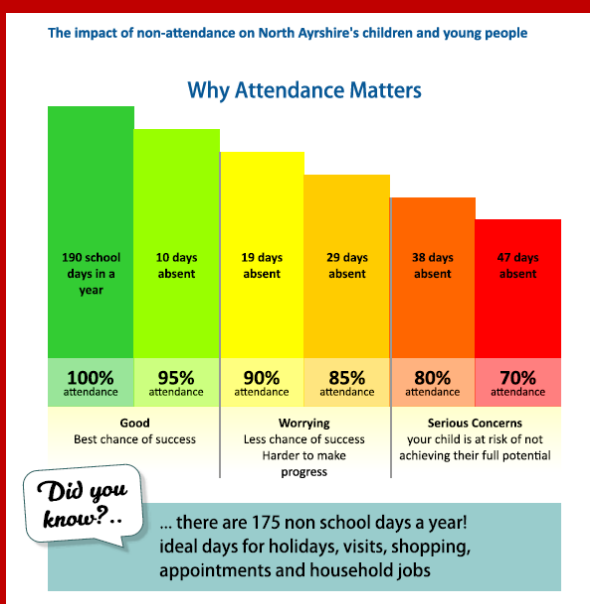

Attendance Matters!

As a school, in line with North Ayrshire's Policy we monitor attendance monthly and will contact you when we see attendance drop below 90% to offer support and guidance.

Our average attendance from August to September is 97.57%. In the interests of your child's education please avoid unnecessary absences where at all possible, as the impact on your child socially and in terms of their attainment can be hugely detrimental.



MINUTES LATE / MINUTES MISSED	IMPACT ON ATTENDANCE IN A YEAR
5 minutes a day =	3.4 days absent = 98.4% attendance
10 minutes a day =	6.9 days absent = 97.6% attendance
15 minutes a day =	10.3 days absent = 94.6% attendance
20 minutes a day =	13.8 days absent = 92.9% attendance
30 minutes a day =	20.7 days absent = 89.2% attendance

A gentle reminder to please adhere to social distancing around the school grounds at drop off and pick up times.

Some parents and children are voicing concerns about the number of parents who are not adhering to this.

We can appreciate that even with staggered starts and different entry points the area around the school inevitably gets busy so please consider the following:

For Drop Off (especially for older pupils i.e. P3-7):

- ❖ Drop off your child away from the school gates and watch them enter from a distance if you feel you have to
- ❖ As soon as you have dropped your child off leave the area around the school. If you wish to chat to another parent make sure this is away from the immediate area surrounding the school

For Pick Up (especially for older pupils i.e. P3-7):

- ❖ Don't arrive too early
- ❖ Arrange a meeting point away from the immediate area near the school to meet your child
