Positive Themes:

- ✓ Primary 1 Transition and 'settling in'
- ✓ The standard of teaching in class and during school closure
- ✓ The caring, nurturing ethos

Areas for improvement:

- ✓ Communication from the Parent Council – we are working with the Parent Council to support this.
- ✓ Some disappointment about no homework this term – we listened to parents and pupils to make this decision. If any parent has concerns about their child please contact either the HT or DHT in future.
- ✓ Lack of information about assessments in Primary 1 – we will include this in our induction information.
- ✓ P2 pupils not being escorted to class – HT has investigated and this should not happen in future.
- ✓ Some parents cannot access engagement sessions during the day – we will consider this as a staff when planning.



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28. For the last four sessions we have received Pupil Equity funding. We have used this fund to provide staff to raise attainment and support pupils and families with their learning and wellbeing. Thank you for your suggestions listed below. We will consider these carefully and report how we will spend our PEF in our School Improvement Plan for Session 2021-22. We have a limited budget compared to other schools so some suggestions are out with our reach, but we will do our best for our pupils. Some of these suggestions have been taken on board by the Parent Council e.g. outdoor learning and visits, and others will be catered for through access to services such North Ayrshire Family Learning team and the Kilwinning Cluster Area Inclusion Worker:

- ✓ Family Learning Worker
- ✓ Homework club
- ✓ Applied to the individual children and their families directly
- ✓ Astro turf to provide a grass area
- ✓ Further resources and IT would be a good use of the funds
- ✓ Gardening and sporting supplies
- ✓ Give back to the children for an outing when allowed
- ✓ Outdoor learning activities.
- ✓ Provide with a tablet for learning, as not all homes have this

School Improvement Priorities Identified:

- Organising activities where pupils and parents/carers can learn together
 - Different ways to take account of parent/carers views
- Supporting the Parent Council to engage and communicate with parents/carers
 - Review our approaches to bullying behaviour

We will work together with the Parent Council, parents/carers, staff and pupils to take these priorities forward in Session 2021-22. Please look out for opportunities to be involved.
