Reading Survey feedback

Miss Johnstone summarised the results of the survey carried out at the November Target Talks.

- Nearly all pupils surveyed either enjoy reading or maybe enjoy.
- Nearly all pupils surveyed feel that they are a good reader, 17% feel that they are not.
- Pupils feel to make reading even more enjoyable:
 - Variety of books
 - Comfy place to read
 - Funny books
 - Football books

- Music books
- Reading games
- Movie based books
- Jeff Kinney books
- Comics
- Gaming books
- Pupils experience a variety of types of reading in class.
- Other activities that pupils take part on in class include IDL/Nessy, DEAR, Independent Reading and Reading journals.
- ➤ 64% of pupils feel very confident/confident completing reading activities.
- ➤ 36% of pupils feel okay or not confident completing reading activities.
- > 92% of Primary 4-7 pupils say that they do not take reading books home.
- > 58% of pupils do not use Bug Club at home, 42% access Bug club at home.
- ➤ When visiting the school library pupils said that they read books/comics, silent reading, read a book of choice and read with a friend.
- ➤ 57% of pupils have visited Kilwinning local library, 43% of pupils have not visited Kilwinning local library.
- ➤ More than half of parents/carers surveyed access Bugclub at home.
- More than half of parents/carers survey do not receive a hard copy of a reading book.
- Almost all parents/carers surveyed say that their child reads for pleasure at home and has access to books.
- A third of parents/carers visit the library, a third do not visit the library and a third occasionally visit the library.
- > 28% of parents/carers feels that their child struggles with reading/phonics.
