Whitehirst Park Primary in Kilwinning is where you'll find North Ayrshire's Gàidhlig Medium Education provision. Established in April 2020, the department follows the mainstream model of education, with the entire Curriculum for Excellence being taught in Gàidhlig. This option is available to all families.

- Access to a second culture
- Literacy in two languages

When does the total immersion phase begin?

The total immersion phase begins in nursery between the ages of 3-5. The Total immersion is a significant first step for your child when learning the Gàidhlig language. When choosing to enrol your child into Gàidhlig Medium Education it is beneficial to have had your child attending a Gàidhlig nursery or playgroup before beginning Primary 1. This ensures your child is already familiar with and confident in using the Gàidhlig language.



How will my child learn in a Gàidhlig total immersed Classroom?



Your child will be learning through the medium of Gàidhlig in all areas of the curriculum. Learning will be implemented through memorising words and actions to songs, listening carefully to stories, recognising rhyme, following repeated instructions and taking part in various games all in the Gàidhlig language. The activities your child completes and the feedback given to your child will all be in Gàidhlig.

What will a GME classroom look like for my child?

Your child will enter a totally immersed Gàidhlig classroom.

- Classroom signs and labels will all be in Gàidhlig
- The teacher will be talking Gàidhlig to your child continually as they take part in structured play activities.
- The activities your child completes and the feedback given to your child will all be in Gàidhlig.


This is the best practice to achieve equal fluency based on the principles of immersion.



How can I support my child's learning through GME?

To support your child in their GME learning journey it is recommended parents attend Gàidhlig learner classes. There are various opportunities within North Ayrshire to learn Gàidhlig online or attend Gàidhlig classes.

It is important that as a parent you are aware of the teaching and learning approaches in a totally immersed Gàidhlig classroom. This will let you prepare your child to understand the environment they will be learning in to ensure they receive the best start to their education, they are happy and they are ready to learn through Gàidhlig Medium Education.



'Gaelic Medium Education is open to all and it is important that parents who are not fluent in Gaelic are aware that they are instrumental in supporting their children's education through the medium of Gaelic.
