Our Achievements

Despite challenging circumstances, our pupils continue to achieve and our school community thrives!



Our achievements and strengths include:

- Our pupils returned to school after the 2020 Lockdown and transitioned well in school life. They showed great delight in being back with their teachers and friends.
- ♣ P5-7 children were proud to have their writing published in various 'Young Writer' publications.
- Primary 4 organised a fantastic 'carnival' as part of their topic, which the whole school attended in their class bubbles.
- Primary 7 took part in outdoor activities such as climbing and canoeing with staff from Arran Outdoor Education Centre.
- We ran a successful 'Purple Day' at the request of a pupil, in order to raise money for Epilepsy Scotland.
- Staff and pupils took part in the North Ayrshire 'Step Challenge' and one of our pupils made it to the overall leaderboard!
- Pupils enjoyed their class bubble Sports Day and our winning pupils were presented with medals from the Parent Council.
- ♣ We introduced whole school dancing in the playground in our bubbles great fun!
- 'Winton's Got Talent' went ahead virtually and was enjoyed by all.



Attainment

Throughout the year we gather lots of information on how our children are progressing in their learning. To

monitor their progress we watch children working through tasks, listen to what they say, ask important questions, set challenges and use some standardised assessments. We also use the Benchmarks set out by the Scottish Government to help us form judgements about our children's attainment.

North Ayrshire Council also ask us to summarise our children's progress in reading, writing, listening and talking as well as numeracy and maths. They ask us to look particularly at children who have reached the end of the Early, First and Second Levels at P1, P4 and P7. Our children continue to make progress.

Key highlights include:

- The majority of children in Primary 1 have achieved Early Level in Reading and Writing and almost all pupils have achieved Early Level in Listening and Talking. Most children have achieved Early Level in Numeracy and Maths.
- Most children in Primary 4 have achieved First Level in Listening and Talking and Numeracy and Maths. The majority of children have achieved First Level in Reading and Writing.
- The majority of children in Primary 7 have achieved Second Level in Listening and Talking, Reading, Writing and Numeracy and Maths and were on target for transferring to secondary school.

At authority level we are supported and evaluated by our Head of Service and Senior Manager.

Looking back: Session 2020-21

Last year we undertook development work in the following areas:

- Reading including the use of an online resource 'BugClub';
- Digital Learning

Our teachers/Early Years Practitioners took part in a variety of professional learning opportunities in order to support learners, such as:

- Nurturing North Ayrshire modules
- 4 2nd level Numeracy Framework training
- PM Reading and Writing training with Stephen Graham
- "Visual Spatial"
- Phonological awareness
- Building Blocks of Numeracy

We continued to promote our 'Winton community' feeling by filming our popular weekly assembly and posting on our SharePoint page so families could feel connected to the school during this time. We offered parents the opportunity to meet with the Senior Leadership Team via Microsoft TEAMs drop-in. We sought parent and pupil views throughout the session and particularly during school closure, to ensure we were meeting the needs of our families during an especially difficult period.
