NUMERACY AND MATHEMATICS

Primary 2 will be learning about...

- number names
- doubles and near doubles
- · adding and subtraction activities
- developing mental strategies
- time
- 3D shape

At home encourage your child to...

- skip count in 2s, 5s, to 100 and beyond
- hunt for 3D shapes around the house and local environment
- talk about different times of the day

TOPIC

Through exploring 'The Seasons', the children will identify different kinds of weather and how it affects our daily activities. The children will talk about days and months of the year, and how the weather changes during the seasons at different times of the year. Also the children will investigate the season Autumn and discover happens what changes take place during this season.



LITERACY

Primary 2 will be learning more about..

- the features of non-fiction texts \u00e9
- reading comprehension strategies
- phonics and spelling
- to use descriptive words in story writing
- begin to form own sentences in spelling and story writing

At home encourage your child to...

- read different kinds of text for information
- retell the main points from a text
- recognise and learn new vocabulary

Unfortunately, due to Covid 19, we are not able to send books home. To encourage reading, your child will be introduced to Oxford Owls. This is a free online resource. A class password will be sent home soon, which the children can access at home.

HOMEWORK

Unfortunately, due to Covid 19, we are still unable to send written work home. Children can continue to learn key PM vocabulary, which can be kept at home and assessed in class, with new words sent home. By practising key vocabulary, your child's reading in class is enhanced.

Your children can continue to use Topmarks to consolidate Numeracy skills e.g. Hit the Button which has adding and subtraction and doubles

HEALTH AND WELLBEING
