Emails/letters will continue for consent to attend clubs etc. and Xpressions messages or texts will be used for urgent information or quick updates.



Updated Break and Lunchtime Arrangements

We are making a change to our break and lunchtime schedule, returning to a whole-school timetable. This means all pupils will have their

SCHOOL LUNCHES AND IPAYIMPACT

Woodlands Primary tries to promote a good uptake of school meals. The lunches are healthy and tasty and save families hundreds of pounds over the years as they are free for all children in P1-P5, and as well as to the families in receipt of certain universal credits or in further education.

However, we are finding that less and less families are pre-ordering their child's lunch across the school. In some classes registration and lunch, which are both completed online, took almost 25 minutes. That is 25 minutes where the teacher is not teaching or supporting pupils with learning. 1 child may take a few minutes to look at the lunch options and choose what they will eat, 25 children takes considerably longer!

We are pleading with families to take 5 minutes on a Sunday or an evening and order your child's lunch with them present. This would also make sure pupils get the lunch they really want each day.
