NUMERACY AND MATHS

Revision of numbers to 20 and beyond and development of mental addition and subtraction skills. This term we will be learning about

- Numbers up to 20 and numbers beyond 100.
- Counting on and back strategy for addition and subtraction equations.
- Division – equal sharing and repeated subtraction.
- Symmetry
- Weight, measurement and volume.
- Money



Ideas to support numeracy at home

- Practise addition and subtraction facts within 10 and 20.
- Practise counting forwards and backwards from any number to 100 and beyond.
- Practise sequencing and ordering numbers to 100 and beyond.

- Practise coin recognition and counting money to the value of £2.00

HOMEWORK

A list of the week's spelling words will be sent home with space for them to be written twice more. There will be a spelling test every Friday. Please continue to practise the list of words sent home as they are related to the books we are reading in class. A familiar read will be sent home to allow your child to read for enjoyment. Please note this is not your child's reading book. Numeracy homework will also be sent home to complete.

LITERACY

SPELLING - Active Literacy spelling resources will be used to develop knowledge of spelling patterns and common words. Spelling will be tested every Friday.
WRITING – There will be a focus on developing imaginative writing skills. Sentence structure and punctuation will also be revised.

READING - PM fiction and non-fiction books will be used to develop literacy skills, with follow-up work to reinforce knowledge and understanding of reading.

Ideas to support literacy at home

- Practise word and sound lists sent home.
 - Read a wide variety of stories with your child and ask them questions that begin with 'who, what, when, where, how or why'.
 - Ask your child to retell the story in order and in their own words.
 - Encourage independent writing at home.
