LITERACY

<u>SPELLING</u> - Active Literacy spelling resources will be used to enable children to spell commonly used words.

<u>WRITING</u> – We will be writing a variety of texts including recounts, exposition and explanation texts.

<u>READING</u> - PM fiction and non-fiction books will be used to develop literacy skills, with follow-up work to reinforce knowledge and understanding of reading.

<u>TALKING AND LISTENING</u> – We will be using a range of resources including SHORs, Oracy and Topic work to enhance Talking and Listening. <u>Ideas to support Literacy at home</u>

- Encourage your child to read a wide variety of different genres including fiction and non-fiction.
- You could join the local library.

NUMERACY AND MATHS

<u>Number & Number Processes -</u> Place Value up to 10 000. <u>Estimating & Rounding</u> – Rounding three digit numbers to the nearest 10

and 100.

<u>Properties of shape including 2D shape</u> – Investigating quadrilaterals, 3D shape – prisms and pyramids.

<u>Addition and Subtraction</u> – using three digit numbers with standard written methods. Mental addition and subtraction strategies within 100.

<u>Expressions and Equations</u> - using greater than, less than, equal to and not equal to.

<u>Time</u> – how many day in a month, year, understanding a variety of calendars and timetables.

Ideas to support Numeracy at home

Practise number bonds to ten and 2,3,4,5 and 10 times tables.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

We will be exploring that there are factors that can positively and negatively affect how we feel e.g. sleep, change and loss, worries, friendships, family relationships, state of health etc.
