

LITERACY

Reading – The children will develop their questioning skills by exploring a range of question types, including literal, inferential, explanation and evaluative. They will also practise making thoughtful predictions and selecting relevant evidence from the text to support their ideas, helping them to become more confident and analytical readers.

Writing – The focus will be on complex narratives, building on their ability to organise ideas effectively. They will develop characterisation, setting and plot, using rich vocabulary and varied sentence structures to engage the reader.

Listening and Talking – As we prepare for our leavers' assembly. The children will practise clear, confident speaking, as well as collaboration, active listening and responding appropriately to deliver an engaging performance.

NUMERACY AND MATHS

In **Numeracy**, the children will focus on measuring and understanding angles, time, weight and volume, applying these skills to real-life problems. They will also develop their ability to collect, interpret and present data, using charts, graphs and tables. Furthermore, they will explain their reasoning clearly to solve increasingly complex problems.

The children will continue to strengthen their **mental maths** and **problem-solving skills**, supporting quick recall, logical thinking and confident application of knowledge. Regular practice of times tables at home is recommended to reinforce learning and enhance success across all areas of numeracy.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Health:

The children will explore their own skills, interests and abilities, setting personal targets and celebrating their successes. They will have opportunities to recognise and share their talents with their families and our local community, particularly through the leavers' assembly.

The children will also examine how daily physical activity, diet, rest and sleep work together to support their overall health and wellbeing.

P.E:

Our gym day is **Wednesday**. Children must bring a full kit, including, a t-shirt, appropriate footwear, shorts/sports leggings or joggers.

IDL (INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING)

PERFORMANCE AND PRODUCTION:

Through expressive arts, the children will work collaboratively to create their leavers' assembly. They will develop skills in drama, music and movement, exploring expression, timing, voice projection, gesture and stage presence. They will also focus on creativity, teamwork and confidence, learning to plan, refine and evaluate their performance as they rehearse. In addition, they will consider audience engagement, storytelling, and the impact of their performance, ensuring their final show is polished, expressive and truly memorable.
