

Update from the Head Teacher

It is lovely to present our first newsletter for session 2016-2017 produced by our S1 "elective class". Our S1 and S2 curriculum includes an "elective" period where our pupils are given the opportunity to pick a subject from a list, which they study in rotation, in order to give them more personalisation and choice. One of the subjects on the list is "newsletter" which I am delighted to say involved writing this edition. This, the first group, have set the bar very high as I am sure you will appreciate when you read the newsletter.

As always our pupils are excellently turned out in full uniform. We are ensuring that blazers are worn in school and outdoor jackets are removed as soon as your child enters the building. Lockers are available for pupils to store their jackets and are available from Mrs Dalzell in the PE Department. They cost £10, £5 of which is returned at the end of the term when the key is handed back. Please note leggings are not part of the school uniform – school trousers should be worn. As we move into the winter, pupils are encouraged to wear school shoes.

We have had an extremely busy start to the term. Indeed over the summer holidays we had two big events. The first was when we attended the opening of the Forgewood Community Centre when we took some of our pupils to meet Her Royal Highness Princess Anne. As always our pupils were excellent and a credit to the school.

This was followed by our summer school when 17 of our new S1 pupils attended various workshops to help them feel more confident and positive about starting at Braidhurst and making a successful transition from primary school to secondary.

We have had three parents' events to date:-

S1 Information Evening when our pupils and their parents were able to find out about all the extra-curricular clubs available to them.

S4 Evening which provided parents information about the national courses, SQA, assessments, study skills and supported study classes. The assessment timeline and supported study programme are available on the school website.

For our S5/6 Evening we tried something different with various break out groups which parents and pupils could opt into selecting from topics such as Scholar, UCAS, Volunteering, Study Skills and various online support sites. We also had 135 pupils on a trip to Alton Towers as part of our Better Relationships, Better Braidhurst policy. Pupils are invited to attend trips and events depending on their number of merits, which they get from class teachers for excellent behaviour and effort, attendance and time keeping. Our next trip will be at Christmas. Pupils are informed on a regular basis how they doing so they can amend their behaviour to enable them to participate. The event was a long day, but a great success.

We also had 50 pupils attend a trip to London over the September weekend where they were frequently complimented on their behaviour. The pupils went to see Mamma Mia, were on the London Eye, did a boat trip down the Thames, went bowling and climbed the Orb. They also managed to squeeze in some shopping!

Finally, we are investigating ways in which we can keep you more informed with your child's progress. We are reporting more frequently throughout the session with our first reports being issued during October. A covering letter will explain our new process. However, in this digital age, we are keen to move away from paper to more electronic communication. For this purpose we need to make sure we have your correct email address and mobile phone number.
