- Braidhurst High School was opened in 1962, to serve the communities of North Motherwell, Forgewood, the Daisy Park and beyond.
- This year is our 60th anniversary.
- Notably ex pupils include; Gary McAllister, Elaine C Smith, John Beaton and Tam Cowan.
- More recently we have had a number of ex pupils who have gained Professional football contracts.
- In addition, we have very high success rates in supporting young people in securing
 positive destinations when they leave school. This includes pupils who move on to
 study at University, College and those who go into apprenticeships and employment.

Will there be a two day visit this year?

What times does school finish at?

- What time is lunch and how long is it?
 Pupils get 45 minutes for lunch, beginning at 12.30pm.
- Can pupils go to local shops at lunchtime.

We prefer that pupils stay on campus for lunch and use the excellent facilities that we have on site. In addition to the lunch hall we also have a snack van that is located at the bottom of the tower block. Pupils are also welcome to bring in a packed lunch.

- What time is interval?
 Morning break is at 10.35am to 10.50am.
- What does the uniform consist of?

Black trousers/skirt, white shirt, black v-neck jumper, Braidhurst tie, black blazer and black shoes/trainers. We have a **reduce**, **reuse**, **recycle** policy at the school and are happy to take donations of uniform that children have outgrown.

Where do you go for PE?

We have fantastic sporting facilities at Braidhurst. These include, a 4G pitch, a grass pitch, the Sports' Barn, two gym halls, a fitness suite, and outdoor basketball/netball courts.

What clubs are there?

There are a huge number of clubs at Braidhurst. The following list is not exhaustive! Basketball, chess, football, netball, futsal, esports, various music clubs, badminton etc.

What entrance do pupils use?

This is very important. To maintain pupil safety all pupils must enter the building through the non-car park entrance. This will ensure pupil safety and give the most direct access to the S1 zone which is located in the area of the playground where the basketball/netball court is found.
