Dear parent/carer/staff member,

NHS Lanarkshire's test and protect team is carrying out contact tracing after people at Cumbernauld Academy tested positive for Covid-19. They are currently self-isolating at home.

NHS Lanarkshire is working closely with North Lanarkshire Council with regards to the case and is contacting close contacts. Public health advice is being given to these individuals and they are being told to self-isolate.

Due to the new Scottish Government restrictions, the household members of children and staff who are required to self-isolate at home are also required to self-isolate for 14 days – if they are residents of North or South Lanarkshire, or of one of the five Greater Glasgow and Clyde local authorities with restrictions. It is recognised that households will find these restrictions very challenging, however, the aim of the restrictions is to reduce the transmission of coronavirus infection, reduce the number of people who become ill and save lives.

Noting the increased infection rates in Lanarkshire, it is important to bear in mind that mixing socially in the community without maintaining physical distancing measures helps the virus to spread widely. It is therefore important that people remain vigilant

and follow physical distancing guidance. Pupils and staff should wash their hands thoroughly and regularly using soap and water for 20 seconds.
